

Privacy Notice for Option to Purchase a Lair for Burial

The Data Controller of the personal information being collected and processed is **Dumfries and Galloway Council**. This privacy notice will inform you why we collect your personal data, how long we will keep your data, the intended processing of your data and any other information, which will make the processing of your data fair, lawful and transparent. Should the Council intend to process your data for another reason, which is not specified in this notice, or for statutory functions; the Council will contact you to provide information.

Why are we collecting your personal data?

Dumfries and Galloway Council are collecting your personal data for the reasons/ purposes of

- Creating and maintaining a client database,
- To make contact with you as and when required

What personal data are we collecting from you?

Dumfries and Galloway Council need to collect the following information from you.

Name, Address, Postcode, Telephone Number.

What is the legal basis for collecting your personal data?

We provide these services to you as part of our statutory function as your local authority. Processing your personal information is necessary for the performance of a task carried out in the public interest by the council.

If the personal data we collect is a statutory, contractual requirement or necessary to enter a contract, if you do not provide your personal data the following may happen:

If we do not receive the information required on the application, we will be unable to issue a lair option certificate granting the right of burial to the applicant.

What will we do with your personal data?

Once the personal data is collected, we will process the information by adding your details to our Lair Options spreadsheet. The name, address and postcode of the eligible applicants will be used to create a lair options certificate and record the lair holder information.

All information contained in the application form will be accessible to the Community Assets Administration Team for processing and issuing an invoice.

Your information may be shared with Audit Scotland, the Auditor General, the Accounts Commission or one of the audit firms appointed by them to ensure fairness and transparency in data processing.

How long will your personal data be stored in the Council?

We will retain your information indefinitely in accordance with the Burials Act (Scotland) 2016.

How will we secure your personal data?

Information held by the Community Asset Administration Team will be secured by:

- password protected computers
- locked cabinets
- restricted access

Your Individual Rights

You have the right to:

- Be informed
- Withdraw your consent at any time
- Request access to your personal data
- Data Portability (this is to move your data where the legal basis is consent or performance of a contract)
- Request your data to be corrected
- Object to the processing of your data
- Request your data to be forgotten (deleted) where the legal basis is consent
- Restrict the processing of your data
- Lodge a complaint with the Information Commissioner's Office (ICO)
